



Land at Cae Canol, Penrhyndeudraeth, Gwynedd



This £10 million development will provide 41 new energy efficient, affordable homes in the town of Penrhyndeudraeth. These homes are being built by Williams Homes (Bala) on behalf of ClwydAlyn and Grŵp Cynefin and in partnership with Cyngor Gwynedd and the Welsh Government.

The scheme is funded by the Welsh Government through Cyngor Gwynedd's Social Housing Grant which aims to achieve Cyngor Gwynedd's target of building 700 social houses across the county by 2026/27.

The Penrhyndeudraeth development will be a mix of 2, 3 and 4 bedroom homes, 1 bedroom bungalows and 1 bedroom apartments. These homes will be allocated through the Common Housing Register and Tai Teg.

PROGRESS UPDATE AND LOOKING AHEAD

As it's approaching the first 12 months on site, there has certainly been a lot of wet weather but despite this, progress of the development has been good. All 41 timber frames have been erected, work is also progressing well with the external works to the bottom half of the site, and the contractors are making the most of the autumnal sunshine to catch up on the render to the top half of the site.

Over the next few weeks, you will see the bottom half of the site really take shape with completed fencing, railings, landscaping and planting (subject to weather conditions remaining favourable).

THE NAMING OF THE DEVELOPMENT

Williams Homes gave pupils at Cefn Coch School the opportunity to name the street of the development at Penrhyndeudraeth.
Penny Lofts, Land and Acquisitions Manager for Williams Homes, recently spent time with the pupils, discussing the names that could be used and geographical and historic significance in the area. Several names were chosen, and the favourite was Maes Deudraeth by Jac, who was awarded a voucher for suggesting the winning name! Well done Jac.

Penny also spent some time during September at Cefn Coch school in Penrhyndeudraeth talking to years 3,4,5 and 6 about the importance of STEM (Science, technology, electronics and mathematics) subjects and teamwork. The three sessions started with a classroom discussion around the team of people required to build houses and how they use STEM subjects in their work. The children then moved into the hall for an interactive exercise building the tallest tower they could using dowels and rubber bands, they learned the importance of starting with a plan, working as a team and collaborating with others.

ENERGY EFFICIENT HOMES

This development will help tackle fuel poverty and help minimise the impact less energy efficient homes can have on people's health and wellbeing.

Built using greener technologies and innovative designs, these new homes will be super energy efficient and benefit from:

- Air source heat pumps
- Solar electricity panels
- Homes positioned to maximise solar gain and natural daylight
- 'Modern Methods of Construction' using as many natural and sustainable materials as possible
- Sourcing materials from local manufacturers and suppliers to keep a low carbon footprint

These homes will make a big difference. They'll help residents support the environment; save precious energy and they could save money in the long run too.
